### • Notebook maintenance – 5%

Before each periodic test, notebook maintenance can be evaluated based on the following parameters –

- (i) Regularity
- (ii) Assignment completion
- (iii) Neatness & upkeep of notebooks

Average of the 3 marks out of 5 will be calculated for aggregating.

# • Subject Enrichment Activities – 5%

Subject Enrichment Activities Comprises of various techniques like ASL / Reading / Dictation / Debate / Public Speaking etc. For language, Lab Activities / Project / Map Work / Model Making / field trips etc. For other subjects which can be conducted 3 times (one in one term per subject) and average marks may be converted out of 5.

3. As the CBSE affiliated schools are required to follow the NCERT syllabus in the upper primary stage, uniformity in the assessment structure and

- examination in all the affiliated schools is felt necessary from class VI to VIII.
- (i) **Scholastic Area**: The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII is of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2 as explained below:
- (v) **Science:** Practical work and activities in Science will be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.
- (vi) **Social Science:** Map or the project work may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.

- 4. **Co-Scholastic Activities (Classes VI-VIII)**: For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following areas be carried out in CBSE affiliated schools by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on 3-point grading scale (**A = Outstanding, B = Very Good** and **C = Fair**). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities:
  - (a) Work Education Work Education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community.
  - (b) Art Education (Visual & Performing Art).
  - (c) Health and Physical Education (Sports/Martial Arts/Yoga/NCC etc.).
- 5. **Discipline** (**Classes VI-VIII**): The students will also be assessed for the discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behavior, values, and tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others. Grading on Discipline will be done termwise on a 3-point grading scale (**A = Outstanding, B = Very Good** and **C = Fair**).

- (ii) **Subject Enrichment Activities:** These are subject-specific activities aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities are to be carried out throughout the term; however, they should be evaluated at the term-end.
- (iii) **Languages:** Aimed at equipping the learners to develop effective listening and speaking skills. The language teachers may devise their own methods and parameters for assessment of the languages.

(iv) **Mathematics:** Activities in Mathematics as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.

### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

- 1. The syllabus once assessed will not be tested again except the above mention portion.
- 2. CBSE has compulsorily intruded Environmental education in schools from classes I-VIII. The student will be evaluated by the school, in the subject & the achievement will be reflected in the form of marks as well as grades.
- 3. Policy regarding Absentees in any of the examinations.....
  - a. All the Exams are compulsory. If a child is absent for any exam, the school has no provision for Re-Exam. In such cases average marks based on the class performance will be considered.
  - b. In case the child has missed the Exam due to some severe Medical problem (medical certificate required.) Re-Exam will be conducted.
  - c. In case the child has missed the Exam due to his/her representation of the school for any Lingaya's society organized event/CBSE event or due to some unforeseen mishap re Exam will be taken.
- 4. No student shall be eligible to take the exam unless he has completed 80% attendance counted from the opening of the school till the commencement of the examination.
- 5. Policy regarding students using unfair means during Examination Student found using unfair means during any assessment will be awarded zero in that subject. No re-exam will be held for such student. The student will not be eligible for any award in that session.

## **Criteria for Promotion to the next class:**

- 1. Promotion is granted on the basis of whole year's performance of the pupil; hence the child must ensure regular attendance & must appear in all the exams.
- 2. There is no provision of double promotion.

3. In classes III-VIII a child must secure minimum D grade in each subject to ensure promotion to the next class. It is compulsory to get pass grades third language. Art & Craft, Music, Instrumental.
